

NOTE. Resources are limited across the CARES system, and services are not always available in each state region. The CARES system is created to quickly help individuals in a housing crisis, but assistance is not guaranteed. Households should continue to search for other solutions to their housing crisis while working through the CARES process with an agency in the appropriate region.

CARES Roles

Access Sites. Access Sites will complete the Housing Crisis Triage to determine if entry into the homeless response system is necessary and appropriate or if the household can be diverted from entering the homeless response system by utilizing mainstream resources. If an individual or family is unable to be diverted, they will be referred to an Assessment Site. Access Sites will make a referral to an emergency shelter if necessary.

Assessment Sites. Assessment Sites will complete the Housing Prioritization Tool to identify linkage to the appropriate housing intervention (e.g., mainstream resources, transitional housing, rapid rehousing, permanent housing).

Housing Providers. Housing providers have designated programs that may provide vouchers or on-site transitional or permanent housing to persons who are experiencing homelessness. Housing Providers collaborate with designated Access and Assessment Sites to streamline access to housing programs.

Stabilization. Stabilization services apply to housing providers and other support service providers helping persons who are homeless or formerly homeless to stabilize once housed. Stabilization services may include landlord engagement, linkage to mainstream resources, and housing navigation.

Auxiliary Service Providers. Auxiliary Service Providers collaborate with designated Access and Assessment Sites and Housing Providers to streamline access to housing programs and supportive services.

Lead Partners. Lead Partners are established to host and facilitate local organizational structures within their region. They can include local homeless coalitions, organizations, agencies, or collaborative groups formed to be lead partners in a given locality. Lead Partners help ensure that CARES policies and protocols are functioning and maintained within their region.

Client Rights

The CARES process is based on a client-centered model and strives to empower clients with the services they choose to receive. Client's rights include:

1. Right to be informed of the CARES process and how they can use it to meet their needs.
2. Right to privacy and confidentiality.
3. Right to be informed of how their data will be utilized and whom it could be shared with.
4. Right to self-determination and to work with service providers that honor that right.
5. Right to Housing First.
6. Right to access and seek services from their Tribal Nation.
7. Right to be informed of CARES grievance policy prior to assessment.
